


PRE-NURSING SCHOLARSHIP


Purpose

To increase recruitment and retention of nurses in remote and rural Scottish communities by:


- Inspiring school-leavers to consider nursing careers and aspire to university education
- Alerting secondary school pupils to the availability of nurse education closer to home














Evaluation

- Pre-nursing scholarship aided school pupils' decision-making to go into nurse education.
- But, little international evidence on the longerterm effect of pre-nursing experience on transition into nurse education.
- Next STEPS follow-on study STudents Experiences after a Pre-nursing Scholarship























Interview Themes

- Making the right choice
- Feeling prepared
- Aiding transition

"I don't think I would be at university if I hadn't done the Pre-Nursing Scholarship" (Student 1) "I greatly enjoyed the Prenursing Scholarship, it **set my mind to nursing** and helped me **gain confidence** to attend university." (Student 9)

"It was an excellent opportunity which **gave me insight** to what it would be like and helped me make
my choice to enter my nursing degree and I love it."

"It gave me a good step in to university." (Student 7)

"I found the pre-nursing scholarship extremely helpful in relation to starting my nursing career. It gave me **great insight** into what was expected of me and what to expect when being put on placements. I feel the scholarship is a great opportunity for aspiring nursing students." (Student 11)

Making the right choice

If I hadn't taken part in it I don't think I would have gone to University straight away – I would have maybe gone college and done healthcare or something like that but this encouraged me to go for it."

Making the right choice

About half way through the scholarship I definitely made up my mind I wanted to do nursing...when I had my experience in placement that was when I definitely knew I wanted to do it."

Feeling Prepared

It was my first taste of a university experience... just to get the feel of it... your still in high school and not sure what is beyond there... it was a really good stepping stone between school and university and confirmed for me that what I wanted to do."

Making the right choice

The placement was definitely the point I knew that I wanted to nursing as I was swithering between primary education and nursing and that kind of pushed me in the right direction to do nursing."

Feeling Prepared

I thought (practice) would be much more regimented, staff were lovely and my buddy was amazing and it so relaxed, a nice environment."

Feeling Prepared

We had classes during the day and that got us used to what Uni was like, that was really helpful having that [Residential] week."

Aiding Transition

I was in community hospital...we did hand hygiene, practiced observations, blood pressure, went through some paperwork... so when I started my programme some things weren't scary because you had seen them
